





At-risk-of-poverty rate 2005-2016, %




The share of persons with an equivalised disposable income below the risk-of-poverty threshold, which is set at 60% of the national median equivalised disposable income (after social transfers).





Balance of trade in goods and services 1995-2017







Value of catch 1994-2017










